What is it about the divine design of a human being that is so intricate that we tend to allow things to build up and stack up inside and the only way to find a release is to either work out till we sweat profusely, cry uncontrollably or just yell loudly?

As I watch the professional football players give it everything they've got to make a tackle or block a pass, I often see them get up from the ground pounding their chests or stopping to give a "Tarzan" type yell as a culmination of the great effort and victory that they've just made. What a way to release all that pent up emotion! It would seem almost unnatural if they remained stoic and just marched back to the line for another go at the opposing team.

When was the last time that you wept before the Lord in prayer as you poured out your heavy heart to him? When was the last time that you danced before the Lord, preached your heart out, or engaged in heavy physical labor in service to help someone less fortunate serving as unto the Lord, until you broke a sweat? When was the last time that you lifted your voice as loud as you could in praise and thanksgiving to the Magnificent One?

Could it be that all that anxiety and stress that you are carrying is because you have neglected to draw near, humbling yourself and seeking the one who made you, had mercy on you and is so deserving of your honor and praise? I challenge you to get alone, get with God and pour your heart out till you have a good cry, break a good sweat, or raise some good praise till your lungs hurt with joy. Now look in the mirror, I bet there's a smile on your face and you feel better. I can't wait for you to call me and tell me about it! Love ya.
