Ron's Reflections

Floyd McClung, the director of All Nations, an international leadership training and church planting network, asks the question: "What is apostolic passion?" I would ask a similar question: "what do we mean when we speak of the passion of Christ?" In just over 45 days we will be experiencing passion week. This is the week of remembering Christ's suffering and death. Jesus chose to give his all, to suffer and die, to go through extreme anguish because he wanted you and I to have the opportunity to come to God through his suffering, death and resurrection to the praise of His glory.

It is safe to conclude that the meaning of passion and suffering are very similar. One definition that we give passion would include everything from romance to hunger pangs. McClung goes on to state that passion to him means "whatever a person is willing to suffer for." This brings into much more clarity what we in our culture are passionate about.

For some it is our job, we love what we do, and we are willing to suffer whatever setbacks or challenges necessary daily to continue to do what we do. For others of us it may be sports and to get in there and play our heart out at the risk of extreme injury is simply seen as the gamble we take. For others of us, it is our body or our money. We will do whatever it takes to please it or get more of it.

So, again the question, what is apostolic passion? To answer this, allow me to point you to any one of Jesus' Apostles. All of them endured extreme suffering and 11 of 12 lost their lives for what they believed in. Only John was privileged to live a long life full of suffering and die a natural death. Is apostolic passion something we see or need to see in the church today? My conclusion is: No, we do not see it in our churches and we desperately need to see it again.

Sadly, in our society today we have developed a culture that is extremely averse to any kind of suffering. We pitch a fit if we must wait for over an hour in an airport or an emergency room and God forbid if our food is 5 minutes late at a restaurant. We are also done with our marriages way too quickly because the passion of romantic attraction has morphed into the passion for our own way rather than being willing to lay down our lives for one another. We are passionate, for sure, but it has to do with our aversion to suffering rather than our willingness to suffer for what we believe in.

Apostolic passion or suffering is when we are locked in and moving towards going any distance to see God glorified and Christ worshipped among the nations. McClung says that "human enthusiasm cannot sustain apostolic passion." We must daily die to ourselves and yield our will to allow God to invest his own passion in us, thus creating a will in us to see His name glorified among all people.

Have you thought about wanting to see Christ exalted and worshipped in all nations recently? Why not ask God to revive your apostolic passion not only to see God exalted and Christ worshipped among the nations, but to see him exalted in your life, your own home and in the lives of your coworkers and friends? I must warn you, It will change your life. Love ya!
